



The Big Fight

It is the 21st of June 1980.

I was still a student and I had found a little job to occupy my time during school break. It makes me very proud.

After my first day, I come home at 13.30 and sit at the table where an enormous hot smoking plate of Linguine Bolognese, prepared by mom, is waiting for me.

I switch on the TV and, at 2 o'clock, they show a boxing match of the night before, from Montreal, the first exceptional fight between the great "Sugar Ray Leonard" and the terrible "Roberto Duran - Manos de Piedra" (Hands of stone) from Panama.

The first bell rings and here we are:

the 2 guys start hitting each other as if there is no tomorrow: BAM BAM BAM without break. sit there frozen with my mouth open in awe and the fork sitting in my hand.

"Why in the world they fight like that?", I ask

myself.

There are no tactics, only punches flying in one after the other.

Leonard was a much better boxer than Duran,

who was the more violent of the 2.

I would later learn about their rivalry and discover that the Panamanian had provoked the American with anything he could... Even turning to Leonard's wife and promising that she would have been a widow after the fight.

The 2 guys could not stand near each other, and their respective hate was very

evident in the ring.

I remember the commentator saying that the only way to reach their peak physical condition and capacity was through daily trainings and I wondered how much they could train because every round was 3 minutes of BAM BAM BAM. It was quite impressive.

Leonard was very nervous but determined to fight Duran on his ground: face to face and hitting the other with blind

In management school they frequently talk about Sun Zu, "The art of war". He says, "Every battle is won before it's fought," and Sugar Ray had left his technical advantage

aside to challenge the rival on his ground, that brought brutality. He lost after 12 memorable rounds.

After the match the American Champion said, "This is the sense of boxing (and of sport): your opponent is your best friend. He never lies. He puts you in front of your limits and, if you can learn the lesson, one day you'll be a better man.'

When I saw the video that was used in the last Townhall at CKH, my memory went back to the day I watched that fight, because at that age you get lessons everywhere: school,

real life but also, in sports.

You see and hear many things for the first time, and they remain in your head to help

you decide what you want, or you don't want to do or, better, who you want or don't want to be. In my job, I wanted to be like them.

That first match was a success that such the revenge fight was organized 5 months later: on the 25th of November 1980 at the Louisiana Superdome in New Orleans. I stayed up all night to watch and it was worth it.

This time, Leonard had learnt the "Sun Tzu" lesson, and he won before the fighting

even began.

Sugar Ray was exactly defined by his name: he danced, he floated around the opponent and kept hitting them as they struggled, throwing out punches that never land. It seemed like a torture to Duran who was getting angrier and angrier with the passing of the rounds.

At the 8th round the bad guy from Panama turned his back to the opponent and said the sentence "NO MAS!". He gave up. Something that a macho man like him will not typically to do... but he did. He chose

to be a loser.

Winning or losing is a choice. It is not about how many points you make; it is about still standing on your feet when the bell rings the end of the fight.

Maybe you lose in any case, but you must always try to even have a chance.



Moscow on the 28th of July 1980.

It is 8 o'clock at night.

Pietro is walking back and forth on the 8th lane of the Olympic stadium in Moscow (Olimpijskij). 90.000 people are watching. The speaker calls the names of the 8 finalists

the 200 meters.

He is the last one, he lifts his hands and salutes the crowd. He thinks about

the long road he took to get to the starting line. It's been extensive difficult, and hampered by



the Italian Government among others.

He probably should not have even been there because in December 1979, Russia invaded Afghanistan (History teaches us nothing) and, for this reason, many countries, including Italy, boycotted the Olympic Games.

Pietro is here as an individual like some other Italian athletes. A controversial choice. It's time, he climbs up on to the starting blocks. He gives one last look back to the other contestants, his companions in the adventure. The most dangerous competitors: Don Quarry from Jamaica and Alan Wells from Great Britain in 7th lane.

He must focus because he was previously eliminated on the 100 meters but, here, on

the 200 meters, he is the actual World Record holder with 19.72. This is his

Bam. The starting gun. They all fly off their starting blocks. He is slower than the others in the first meters.

"No, it can't be like that again!" He thinks. Yes, because in Montreal 1976 Pietro finished 4th and then he went crazy from the loss. All those hours training, all those expectations, all those questions from the journalists.... Nothing in hand! Fourth!

"No, this time it will be different."

He says to himself. Pietro sees Alan Wells on his left. He is 3 meters ahead and seems to be accelerating. They are at the end of the corner and Pietro is also 7th but now he runs hard: Goodness me, he runs!

His feet have become lighter, his steps have become longer. He is flying. Pietro catches Voronin and Dunecki from Poland, then Hoff from East Germany and then Leonard from Cuba.

Only 50 meters left. He catches Quarry, only 30 meters left. Wells is still ahead, 20 meters left.

He thinks, "Run, Pietro, run like the wind!" He thinks about his challenges against the cars when he was a young guy in Barletta. The sun in southern Italy was high up in the sky and the weather was hot. The adults used to bet on these races, and he smiles thinking back to the time when he beat a Porsche on the 50 meters!

He's almost at the end, but the English guy is still a little bit ahead but,

maybe, maybe....

Last steps, he crosses over the finish line!

He looks back; wells is behind!

Pietro goes crazy. "I have won, I have won!", he thinks. He keeps on running with the arms up in the air but then, immediately he points his index finger high.

This means "I am Pietro Mennea, I am

here, Look who's number one!".

This is the story of Pietro Mennea and his one and only Olympic Gold Medal but also as a testament to one of the greatest Italian athletes ever. He is a role model in sport and in life for his determination and dedication to work and his passion.

Pietro retired from athletics in 1988 at the age of 36 after five Olympic 200 meters finals in a row. His world record of 19.72 was

beaten, after years, by Michael Johnson 1 in the Olympic games of 1996 (Atlanta). That time is still the European record.

Pietro died in 2013 at the age of

We learn from him that we are all on this earth for a reason and if we

find out what that reason is, we must give all we can to it. Only once we do that, we can discover our potential and, most of all, we can live the rest of our life without regrets. In peace.

Knowledge Lessons:

Include Expertise and Diversity

Ignoring unique perspectives from a group of diverse thoughts can sometimes be an unfortunate mistake.

- Diversity of Experience: Experience sharpens our focus and understanding. Someone who does not have that experience does not know what he or she does not know.
- Diversity of Background: Duke states that leaders should be careful not to recruit people just like their own background. Having different backgrounds, temperaments, talents, and convictions makes a team stronger.
- 3. Diversity of Personality: There is a lot of information about introverts and extroverts. The thing to point out as the author does is that typically if an organization is full of introverts, then likely an extrovert will do a better job of driving results, whereas the opposite would be true with an organization full of extroverts it is typically the introvert that can lead more effectively. That is why it is imporant to diversify your team with different personalities.
- 4. Get Front-Line Input: Some organizations don't take the time to get down on the front line to find out what is going on. Listen to what they say, amplify what they say, and include what they say. Listen actively (C5) to them. Typically, they have the solution to the challenge. You just need to seek input and listen.

Learn Every Day

Organizations that understand the importance of learning for all employees will outperform those who don't.

- Watch, Listen, Read: Look for one professional association, newspaper, or book to incorporate into your daily habit of reading.
- Coach and Be Coached: Look for those inside and outside of the organization to help you scale your leadership practices. A good coach will not only tell you that you did good but will also tell you what you need to improve at.
- Share Learning: Sharing your knowledge will only make your team better.
 Il highly encourage all of you to take 30 minutes on Friday and bring your small teams together to share what went well, what did not go well, and what you learned.

Train and Develop

Training and Development are two different ideologies. Training address what is needed now, whereas, development, takes time and addresses what will be needed in the future.

1) Close Training Gaps: As a leader we should consistently be looking for ways to identify training that will help our teams become more efficient. If you, the leader, can conduct the training yourself it is highly recommended. If it is an area where you might not be strong or knowledgeable then look for a resource to assist your team. I do not know marketing as good as I would like to and I'm smart enough to know that we needed someone better than I to conduct training with our marketing team, therefore, we decided to bring in a consultant to help our team get the training and development they needed to be successful. I have learned along with my marketing team at the same time and have benefited from their training. Marketing has done a great job of cross training to the point where one can help pick up for the other when needed in dire situations

2) Stop Leading... Sometimes: Train those under your influence to be better than you. Duke quotes the United States Army Field Manual, "Train your subordinates, to plan, prepare, and execute, and assess well enough to operate independently". Give your subordinate leaders the opportunity to lead. By doing this you are helping prepare the next level of management for career development. It is advisable to help put each one in a favorable position to succeed with certain guard rails but move out of the way and give them a chance. Last of all, the next time one of your subordinates brings you a problem or challenge, give it back to them and ask them to produce a solution and present it to you. This is part of development.
